6. The method(s) used by the institution to determine which students are eligible to receive Emergency Financial Aid Grants and how much they would receive under the CRRSAA program.

The method that TBI implemented to determine a students' eligibility to receive Emergency Financial Aid Grants is the students enrollment status at Taylor Business Institute as of January 29, 2021 along with the students status as a U.S. citizen or national, permanent resident or other eligible noncitizen (due to the 1996 welfare reform law- the Personal Responsibility and Work Opportunity Reconciliation Act, P.L. 104-193) who has completed and submitted a 2020-2021 Federal Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) and for new students who have completed 2021-2022 Federal Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) generating an EFC.

Students who fall under this category of U.S. citizenship with a calculated Expected Family Contribution (EFC) will receive the CRRSAA Emergency Financial Aid Grant based on the value calculated and placed within the designated level of exceptional need.

The students who are defined by 8 U.S.C. section 1641 (including refugees and persons granted asylum) will have their award amount reduced due to the requirement of the application for the F-1 Visa which requires the individual demonstrate the financial strength to study in the United States. These students are not eligible for federal financial aid and are not measured by the Department's standards of need. In an effort to serve as many international students as possible the CARES Award for these individuals will be \$250.
